WHAT IS TSPLOST?

- Transportation Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax
- November 8, 2016, Fulton County residents (not including the City of Atlanta) voted to approve a 0.75-cent TSPLOST I
 - April 1, 2017 to March 30, 2022
 - Expected to collect \$32M for Milton
- Cities implement approved project list
 - Purposes/Projects in 3 tiers
 - Roads, intersections, bridges, sidewalks, bicycle paths, and transportationrelated purposes

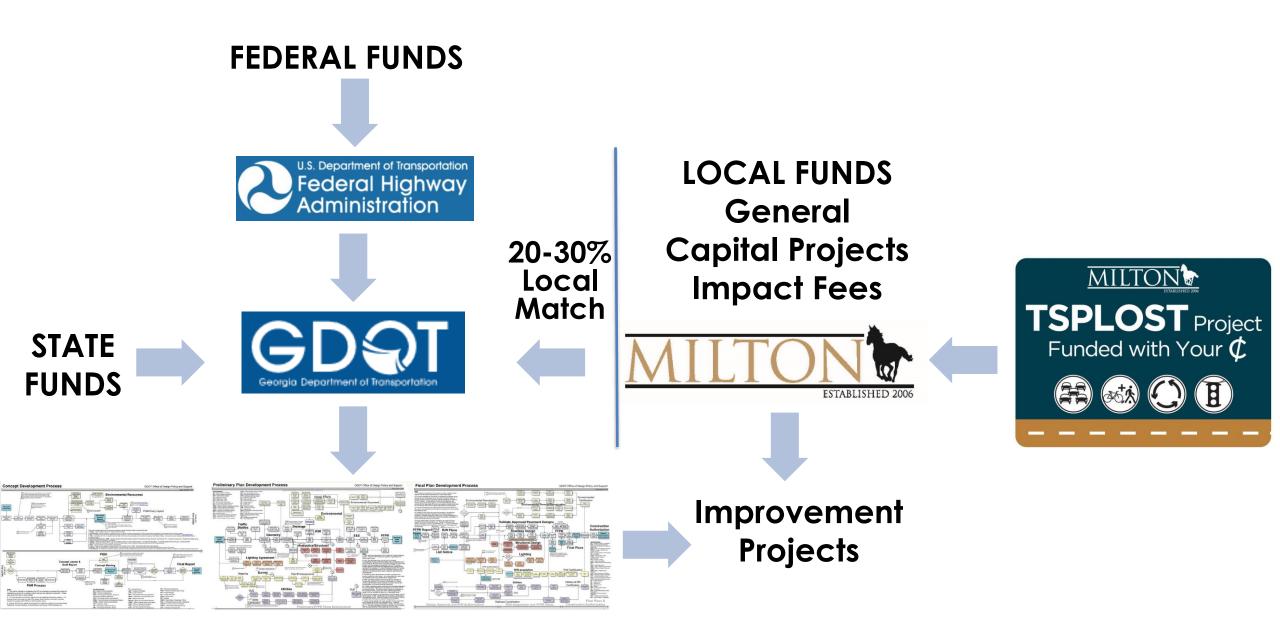

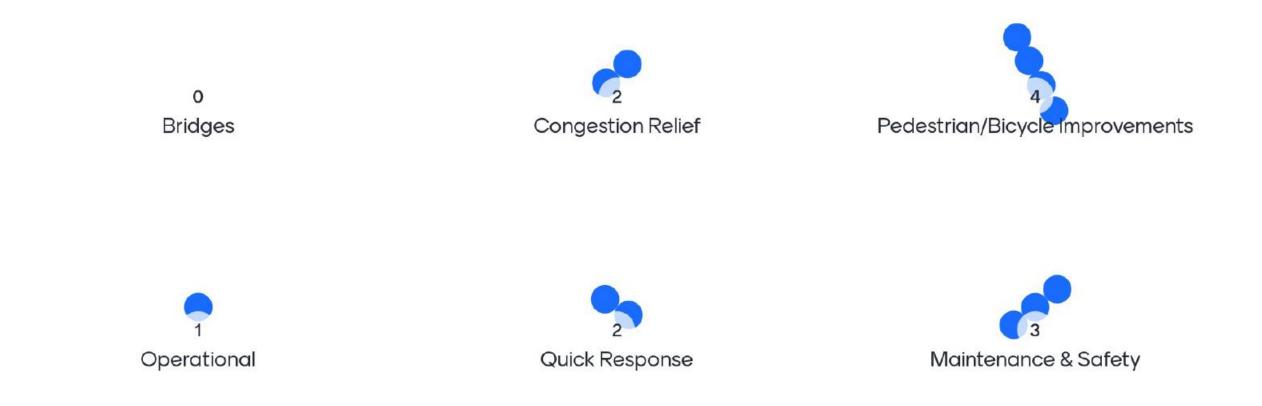

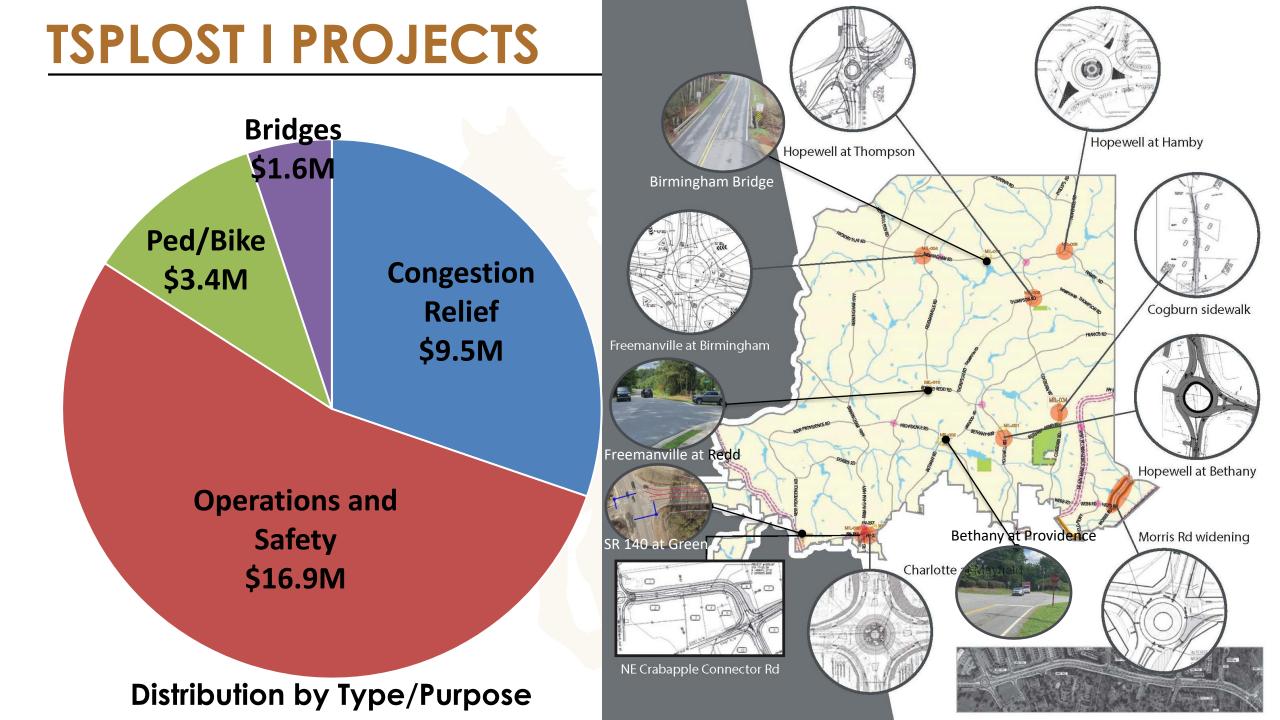
